Discussion questions:

How would you respond to someone who asked, "Who is Jesus?"

Why do you think people didn't want to believe Jesus was the Savior?

Jesus is the Savior, Messiah, and Lamb of God. He came to live a sinless life, die on the cross in our place, and rise again in glory to break the power of sin and death. How does the truth of His identity clarify your life, purpose, and direction?
